

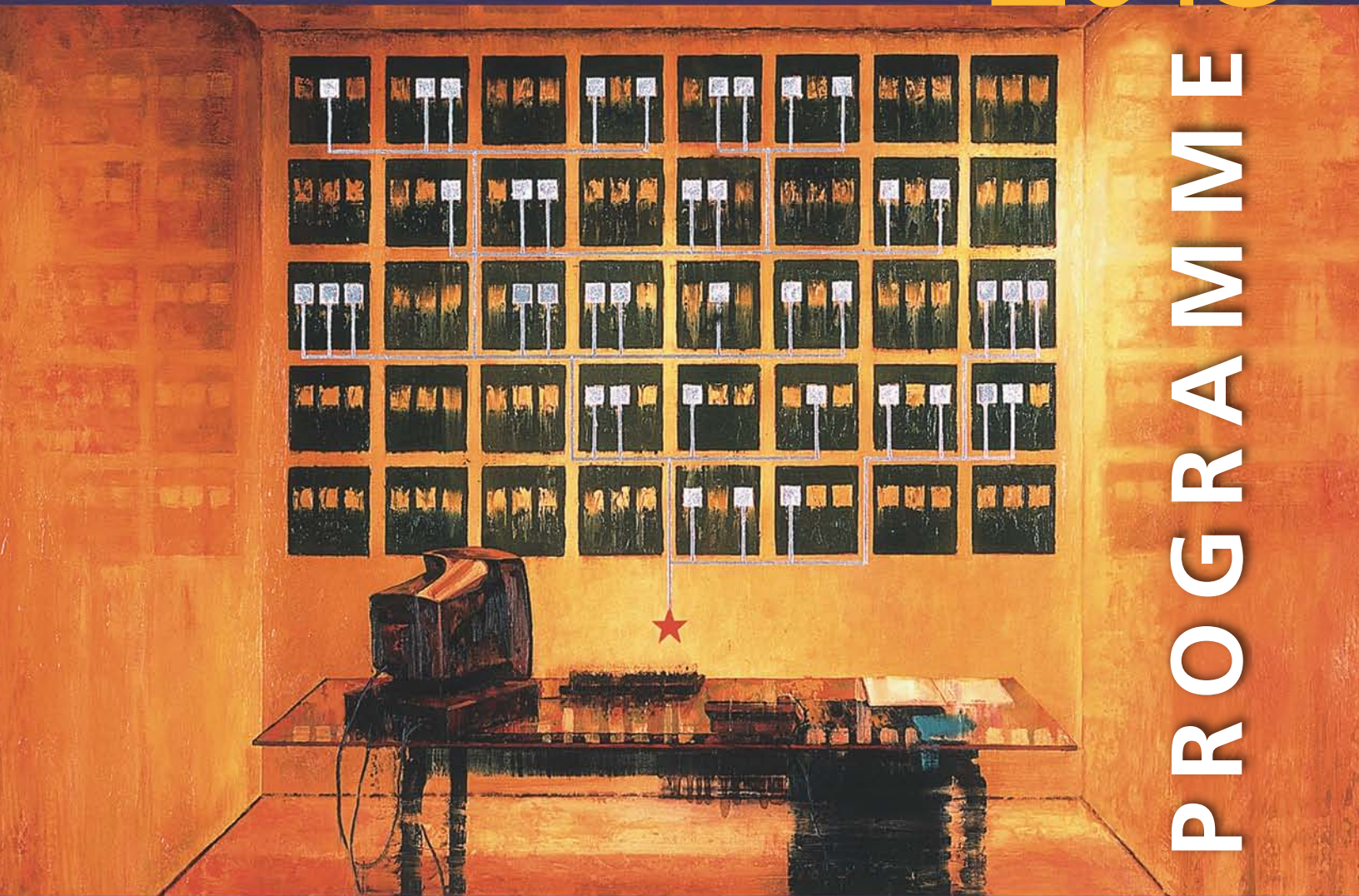

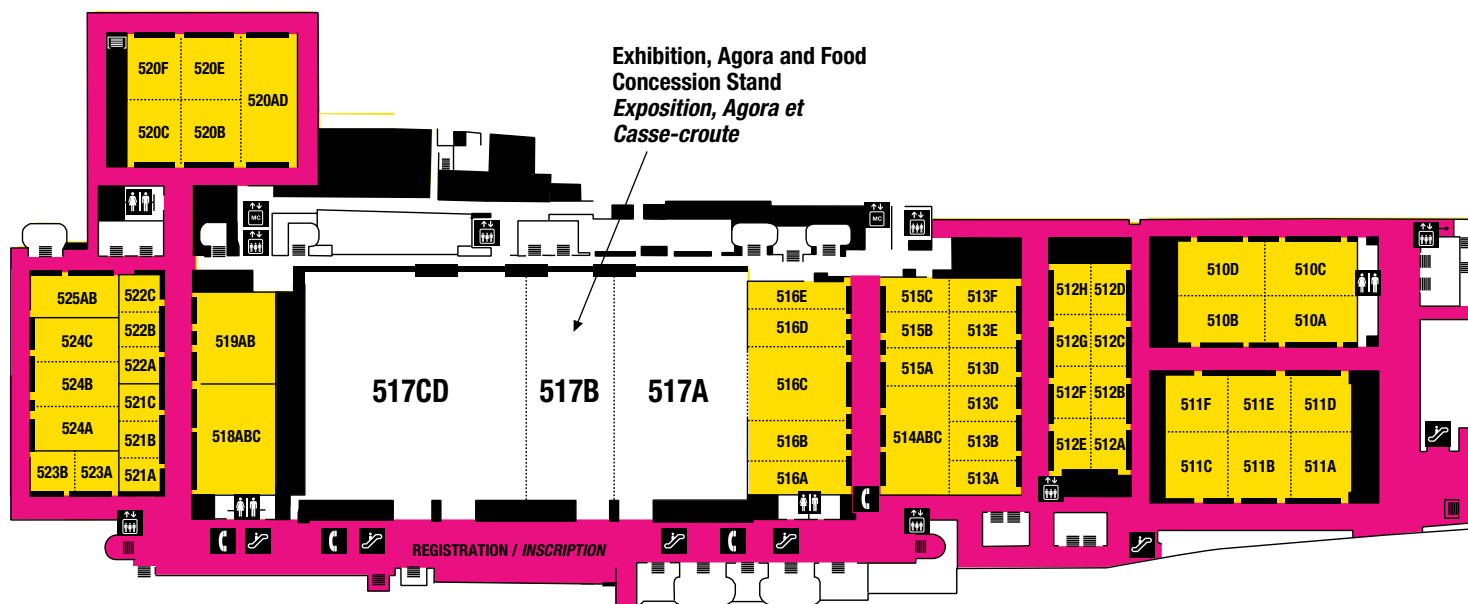

The 2013 Forum addresses the very important theme of 'social transformations and the digital age', developments which affect how people organize their work, how they communicate with one another, what they do in their leisure time, and how politics, education, healthcare and the media are conducted. The widespread diffusion of digital technologies raises new ethical and moral considerations, and brings into sharp relief some very old ones, for example about what it is to be human, and what privacy means, for ourselves and for research participants. These developments also affect how social scientists do their work – not only are there novel objects and topics of research out there but also new ways of collecting, analyzing and representing data and results. All of these topics, and many more, are on the Forum programme.

The Forum is a unique opportunity for social scientists to meet across disciplines. In some areas, ICTs as we used to call them have long been a topic of research; others have realized more recently that social media and older manifestations of digital technologies are worthy of attention, as both object and method. Now that digital technologies reach so deeply (and of course sometimes not so deeply and not for everyone) into all areas of human activity, it is a good moment for social scientists to come together, to learn from other disciplines about how to make sense of these socio-technical changes in order to be able to act effectively.

Pulling together an event like this requires a lot of work by many different people. The members of the Scientific Programme Committee (see list on p. X) come from many disciplines, and are based around the world. They read, commented upon, and processed the huge volume of abstracts in good faith and with good humour, both of which are essential in interdisciplinary and intercultural communication. The IPSA (International Political Science Association) office in Montreal provided the local support, which means they did pretty much everything, including liaising with the venue and with all of the organizers, sponsors and participants. Yee Fun Wong, and her colleagues Roksolana Bobyk, Sarah Veilleux-Poulin, Eric Grève and Valerie Beech, have done an amazing job in keeping track of people, abstracts, money, the website, publicity and rooms, both hotel and conference. I am very grateful to Heide Hackmann, Executive Director of the International Social Science Council (ISSC), for her faith in me when she invited me to take on this challenging role. I hope she and everyone else are pleased with the results. Working with her colleague, Mathieu Denis, the ISSC Science Officer, was an unexpected pleasure. His intellectual insights and fantastic organizational skills were a constant source of inspiration and support. His contributions to the programme and its organization cannot be praised highly enough.

The effects of digital technologies on conference planning are hardly discussed within the scholarly literature about 'social transformations and the digital age'. Even though I am on the public record in expressing skepticism about some of the wilder, celebratory claims made about the transformative potential of digital technologies, even I can't imagine how we could have done this without email, databases, word processing, search engines, and all those mundane applications that many of us now take for granted.

The response to the call for papers was overwhelming, and thus there is a rich array of scholarship on offer during the Forum. Three wonderful plenary sessions are scheduled, reflecting different themes and approaches; one on each day thus also providing an occasion for all participants to gather together. During the other time slots, the great challenge will be to choose amongst the fascinating array of scholarship on offer so we will all have to make difficult choices between the many sessions, but there is much to stimulate our intellectual curiosity and to provoke discussion and debate about important challenges facing society.

*Le Forum 2013 aborde un thème d'une grande importance : Transformations sociales et ère numérique, et traite des développements qui affectent la façon dont les gens organisent leur travail, comment ils communiquent entre eux, ce qu'ils font dans leur temps de loisir, et comment la politique, l'éducation, la santé et les médias s'en trouvent modifiés. La vaste diffusion des technologies numériques soulève de nouveaux problèmes d'ordres éthique et moral, mais en réactualise aussi de très anciens, tels la notion d'être humain ou encore la définition de la vie privée, du point de vue des personnes ou de celui de la recherche. Ces développements affectent également les méthodes de travail des chercheurs en sciences sociales, ils ouvrent la voie à de nouveaux champs d'étude et transforment la façon dont nous recueillons, analysons et présentons les données et les résultats.*

*Le Forum mondial est une occasion unique d'échanges entre chercheurs des différentes disciplines des sciences sociales. Ce qu'on appelle les TIC (technologies de l'information et de la communication) sont depuis longtemps un objet d'étude ; mais plus récemment on a vu des chercheurs de diverses disciplines se tourner vers les pratiques associées aux réseaux sociaux et d'autres technologies plus anciennes. Les nouvelles technologies ont infiltré pratiquement tous les aspects de l'activité humaine (à des degrés variables certes et avec des inégalités évidentes). Il semble donc que le moment soit opportun pour que les chercheurs en sciences sociales de se retrouver afin de débattre, apprendre les uns des autres et tente de faire le point sur des solutions possibles face aux problèmes soulevés par ces changements sociaux et technologiques.*

*Mettre en œuvre un tel événement requiert un travail considérable de la part de nombreuses personnes. Les membres du Comité Scientifique du Programme (voir liste p. X) sont issus de multiples disciplines et proviennent de différentes régions du monde. Ils et elles ont consciencieusement lu et annoté une quantité considérable de propositions de contribution, faisant preuve d'esprit et de bonne humeur, ce qui est essentiel dans toute entreprise interdisciplinaire et interculturelle. Just over two years ago, the International Social Science Council decided to hold its second World Social Science Forum in Montreal. Our research councils, universities and researchers were excited at the idea of coming together to reflect on issues related to the development of new technologies and their impact on scientific research and on the day-to-day lives of citizens. It should as no surprise, then, that IPSA was keen on collaborating on the organization of this event.

In this new century, the relevance of the human and social sciences and their contribution to the development of societies are constantly being called into question. In the aftermath of the Second World War, our international associations were created with the goal of promoting dialogue between peoples and fostering universal access to education and knowledge in all countries. This humanistic thrust also sparked debates on ideas, which in turn gave rise to major social changes. Today, as we set the course for our new century, a well-intentioned populism has surfaced, and many have begun to question the usefulness of political science as a tool for ending conflict or simply inciting decision-makers to respond to demands from citizens and improve governance in our states. In recent years, new means of communication have emerged, not least the Internet and smartphones. These tools have not only transformed our way of life, but they have also changed the way we apprehend reality and see the world. What's more, they have altered our value systems while giving the impression of greater equality among citizens. Some believed that the Internet would serve as an exemplary democratization tool while providing free access to all the information available on the Web. Quickly, though, we have been forced to realize that some data are not necessarily available to everyone, particularly in the states of the Global South, once again leading to certain inequalities.

# World Social Science Prizes

During Special Events held on **Monday, 14 October, 2013**, the ISSC will award three prestigious international prizes:

- Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Social Science Research 2012 and 2013
- Mattei Dogan Prize for Excellence in Interdisciplinary Research 2013

## Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Social Science Research

The Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Social Science Research was first awarded in 1981 in honour of Stein Rokkan (1921-1979), President of the International Social Science Council from 1973 to 1977. The Prize is awarded for very substantial and original contributions in comparative social science research. Submissions can be either an unpublished manuscript of book length, or a printed book, or collected works published no more than two years before the award year. Since 2008, and thanks to the generous support of the University of Bergen, where Stein Rokkan was professor of Comparative Politics, the Stein Rokkan Prize amounts to €5000 and is awarded on an annual basis and is presented jointly with the European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR).



### 2013 - Dorothee Bohle & Bela Greskovits

The Jury for the 2013 Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Social Science Research has awarded the prize to Dorothee Bohle and Bela Greskovits, for their book entitled "Capitalist Diversity on Europe's Periphery" (Cornell University Press 2012).

Dorothee Bohle is Professor of Political Science at Central European University, Budapest. She specialises in the comparative political economy of Eastern Europe, with a focus on welfare regimes, industrial relations and tiny states. Béla Greskovits is Professor of International Relations and European Studies at Central European University. His research interests are in social movements and protest, and the political economy of policy reform and transnational integration in Eastern Europe.

In "Capitalist Diversity on Europe's Periphery", the two authors trace the form that capitalism took in East European countries, the assets and liabilities left behind by socialism, the transformational strategies embraced by political and technocratic elites, and the influence of transnational actors and institutions. They also evaluate the impact of three regional shocks: the recession of the early 1990s, the rolling global financial crisis that started in July 1997, and the political shocks that attended EU enlargement in 2004.



### 2012 - Pepper D. Culpepper

The winner of the XVIIth Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Social Research (2012) is Professor Pepper D. Culpepper from the European University Institute's Department of Political and Social Sciences.

In his book on "Quiet Politics and Business Power" (Cambridge University Press 2010), Culpepper takes issue with Abraham Lincoln's view of the democratic process. He argues that open contestation, political conflict, compromise and accountability of politicians applies only to a smaller fraction of all major political decisions, above all to those issues which are marked by high political salience, a predominance of formal institutions — defined as rules established in the legislative arena by state actors — and moderate or low levels of complexity.

Culpepper's study builds empirical and theoretical bridges to the fields of business administration, to law and to comparative political economy more generally. "Quiet Politics and Business Power" is a major contribution to the study of political and economic institutions, processes and outcomes; and a deserving winner of the prize.

## Mattei Dogan Prize for Excellence in Interdisciplinary Research

The Mattei Dogan Prize for Excellence in Interdisciplinary Research was established in 2005 to distinguish social scientists whose work has advanced knowledge in the social sciences by crossing disciplinary boundaries and recombining different specialised subject fields in their research or writing. The first Prize was awarded to David E. Apter, Professor Emeritus of Comparative Political and Social Development, Yale University.

- The amount of the prize is US\$5000.



### 2013 – Amitrajeet A. Batabyal

Amit Batabyal has been the Arthur J. Gosnell Professor of Economics at the Rochester Institute of Technology since 2000. He is the author of 7 books (mostly in the fields of ecological economics and invasive species management), over 180 papers in international prestigious scientific journals, and the recipient of over 20 awards and honours throughout his career. The members of the jury were particularly sensitive to the quality and diversity of the work he has already accomplished at this stage of his career.

# Prix du Conseil international des sciences sociales

## Le prix Stein Rokkan en recherche comparative en sciences sociales

Le prix Stein Rokkan en recherche comparative en sciences sociales fut décerné pour la première fois en 1981 en l'honneur de Stein Rokkan (1921-1979), président du Conseil international des sciences sociales de 1973 à 1977. Le prix récompense les auteurs de contributions originales et substantielles dans le domaine de la recherche en sciences sociales. Depuis 2008, et grâce à la généreuse contribution de l'Université de Bergen, où Stein Rokkan était professeur de politiques comparées, le prix Stein Rokkan offre une bourse de € 5,000 remise sur une base annuelle, et qui est présentée conjointement avec le European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR).



### 2013 - Dorothee Bohle & Bela Greskovits

Le jury du Prix Stein Rokkan en recherche comparative en sciences sociales a décerné le prix 2013 à Dorothee Bohle et Bela Greskovits, pour leur livre intitulé "Capitalist Diversity on Europe's Periphery" (Cornell University Press 2012).

Dorothee Bohle est professeure de sciences politiques à l'Université d'Europe centrale à Budapest. Elle se spécialise dans l'économie politique comparée en Europe de l'Est, avec un accent sur les régimes de protection sociale, les relations industrielles et les petits Etats. Béla Greskovits est professeur de relations internationales et d'études européennes à l'Université d'Europe centrale. Ses

intérêts de recherche portent sur les mouvements sociaux et la contestation sociale, et l'économie de la réforme politique et de l'intégration transnationale en Europe de l'Est.

Dans "Capitalist Diversity on Europe's Periphery", les deux auteurs retracent la forme que le capitalisme a pris dans les pays d'Europe orientale, les atouts et les responsabilités laissés par le socialisme, les stratégies transformationnelles embrassées par les élites politiques et technocratiques, et l'influence des acteurs et des institutions transnationales. Ils évaluent également l'impact de trois chocs régionaux: la récession du début des années 1990, la crise financière mondiale qui a débuté en juillet 1997 et les chocs politiques qui ont accompagné l'élargissement de l'UE en 2004.



### 2012 - Pepper D. Culpepper

Le jury du Prix Stein Rokkan en recherche comparative en sciences sociales a décerné le prix 2012 au professeur Pepper D. Culpepper du département de sciences politiques et sociales de l'Institut universitaire européen.

Dans son livre "Quiet Politics and Business Power" (Cambridge University Press 2010), Culpepper s'oppose au point de vue d'Abraham Lincoln sur le processus démocratique. Il soutient que la contestation ouverte, les conflits politiques, les compromis et les responsabilités des politiciens s'appliquent uniquement à une fraction minime de toutes les grandes décisions politiques, et surtout aux questions d'une saillance politique élevée, une prédominance des institutions formelles – définies comme règles établies dans le domaine législatif par des acteurs étatiques - et des niveaux modérés ou faibles de complexité. Son livre reprend un thème majeur de l'œuvre de Stein Rokkan: à savoir le rôle des intérêts économiques dans la politique démocratique.

L'ouvrage du Dr. Culpepper est étroitement liée à la perspicacité de Rokkan dans son analyse de l'opposition politique en Norvège, se résumant par la formule suivante: «les votes comptent, mais les ressources décident». "Quiet Politics and Business Power" soulève une problématique majeure présente dans toutes les démocraties, et souvent négligés par les politiques et politologues sur les conflits politiques évidents, les coalitions partisans et le débat public. Il contribue à la théorie démocratique empirique, en redirigeant l'attention sur l'élaboration des politiques dans des domaines moins saillants, mais extrêmement importants.

En outre, l'étude de Culpepper construit des ponts empiriques et théoriques pour les domaines de l'administration des affaires, et du droit, en passant par l'économie politique comparative en général. "Quiet Politics and Business Power" est une contribution majeure à l'étude des institutions politiques et économiques, de leurs processus et de leurs résultats, et constitue un ouvrage vainqueur méritant du prix.

## Le prix Mattei Dogan pour l'excellence en recherche interdisciplinaire

Le prix Mattei Dogan pour l'excellence en recherche interdisciplinaire fut établi en 2005 pour récompenser le travail de chercheurs qui ont fait avancer le savoir en sciences sociales en faisant fi des frontières disciplinaires et en combinant différentes spécialisations dans leur champ de recherche ou d'écriture. Le premier prix Mattei Dogan fut remis à David E. Apter, professeur émérite en politiques comparées et développement social de l'Université Yale. La bourse d'USD \$ 5,000 est généreusement commanditée par la Fondation Mattei Dogan.



### 2013 - Amitrajeet A. Batabyal

Amit Batabyal est le Arthur J. Gosnell Professor of Economics au Rochester Institute of Technology depuis 2000. Il est l'auteur de sept ouvrages (touchant particulièrement aux domaines de l'économie écologique et la gestion des espèces invasives), plus de 180 contributions dans des journaux scientifiques prestigieux, et le récipiendaire de plus de 20 prix et distinctions tout au long de sa carrière.

# Practical Info

## Canada

Canada is a diverse North American country made out of 10 provinces and 3 territories. Located in the northern part of the continent, it extends from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and is the second largest country in the world. It shares the world's biggest border with the United States, totalling 8,900 kilometers (which includes both land and shared waterways), as well as two maritime boundaries with the autonomous Danish territory of Greenland and the autonomous French overseas islands of Saint Pierre and Miquelon. Canada is a federal state governed as a parliamentary democracy and a constitutional monarchy, with Queen Elizabeth II acting as head of state. Canada has a population of 35 million and two official languages, English and French.

## Montréal

With a population of about 1.7 million (or over 3.8 million if you include the greater metropolitan area), Montreal is the largest city in the province of Quebec and the third most populated city in Canada. With its French roots, British heritage and North American upbringing, Montréal offers Old World flair mixed with New World energy, 17th-century colonial architecture sharing the same skyline with sleek high-rises, plus an eclectic blend of cultural influences from all over the world. From historic Old Montréal to the trendy Plateau to family-friendly HoMa, charming Little Italy and a safe, always happening downtown core, there's lots to explore and lots of ways to get up close and personal with the locals, all within safe walking distance.

## Canadian Currency

Canadian currency is the Canadian dollar, which is divided into 100 cents. There are 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 dollar bills. Smaller coins are 5, 10, and 25 cent pieces. Banking and credit cards are also welcome almost everywhere. Cash in foreign currency is not generally accepted.

## Communications

### INTERNET

Most hotels offer access to Wi-Fi in their rooms or through their Business Centers. Certain areas of the city, like the Old Port offer free Wi-Fi access. While you are on the Promenade (see map of coverage area), simply tell your device to connect to the network called "Vieux-Port de Montréal". Next, open your Web browser. A connection page will open. Click "Connect" and you're done! You will now be able to surf the Web.

Ile Sans Fil, a non-profit organization, provides free internet access in more than 250 public places in the city of Montreal. To view a complete list of libraries, bistros, cafés, parks and other places serviced by Ile Sans Fil, please visit

Most coffee shops and restaurants offer their patrons free internet access. Montreal is also well-provided for with internet cafés and there are several throughout the city.

### INTERNATIONAL AND NATIONAL PHONE CALLS

The country code of Canada is +1 and the local area code for Montreal is 514. To call Montreal from abroad, dial 00 1 514 followed by the local number. International phone cards with cheap rates can be found at a variety of corner stores in Montreal. Pay phones accept phone cards, credit cards and change.

## Driving

Québec uses the metric system, so speeds are indicated in kilometres (100 km/h = 62 mph) and gas is sold in litres (3 3/4 litres = 1 US gallon). Rights on reds are strictly prohibited on the island of Montréal. Use a hand-held cell phone that does not have a hands-free function in prohibited while driving. Parking in the city centre is not difficult; there are many of paid parking lots and meter parking. Some parking meters have been replaced by automatic pay stations. Numbered blue and white signs indicate where these parking spaces are available.

## Electricity

Electrical voltage in Canada is 110-120 volts, 60 Hertz (cycles per second). Plugs have two flat prongs. Multi-voltage appliances (laptops, etc) will require a plug adapter. For appliances of 220-240V, a step-up transformer will be needed in addition to the adapter.

## Exchange

Exchange facilities are available at Trudeau Airport, most banks and hotels. The exchange rate is roughly \$1.00 USD = \$1.05 CAD.

## Gastronomy

As the city with the largest number of restaurants per capita in North America, chances are that you're going to find just the region or type of food you crave in Montréal – and it's going to be delicious! Ingenuity is the main ingredient in a unique cuisine that deftly mixes invention with tradition. The result? An inspired blend of local influences, daring world flavours and European heritage.

## Health

It is strongly recommended that visitors get their own medical insurance program to cover those expenses during their stay.

## Opening Hours

Most shops are open Monday to Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Thursday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. They are usually closed on legal holidays – and on January 2 in the majority of cases – but some establishments (supermarkets, SAQ outlets, etc.) may still be open.

## Personal Safety

Although Montreal is a safe city for foreigners, we recommend that you use common sense to avoid any unfortunate encounters. Please note that the police emergency number is 911.

## Taxes & Tips

There are two applicable taxes in Québec: a federal Goods and Services Tax (GST) of 5 % and a Québec provincial tax (TVQ) of 9.975 %. A 3.5 % accommodation tax is also in effect in Montréal. It is customary to tip restaurant waiters, taxi drivers, hairdressers, are also normally tipped 15%. Bellhops, porters, doormen, etc. generally receive at least \$2 per suitcase or per service rendered. Coffee and food counters often have a tip cup next to the cash register; spare change is always appreciated.

## Transportation

### AIRPORT

The Montréal-Trudeau Airport is located just 20 km from downtown. Self-service check-in is available for all flights, and there is now free Internet access throughout the terminal. In addition, real-time flight information is provided by text message (SMS).

### BIXI

The system is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week from May to November. This service enables citizens and tourists to borrow a bike from a station, travel to their destination and return the bike to any other station across the network (400 stations and 5,000 bikes).

Montréal switches to Eastern Daylight Time (summer time zone) on the second Sunday of March and returns to Eastern Standard Time (winter time zone) on the first Sunday of November. The time difference between Montréal time and Greenwich Mean Time is less than 5 hours in the winter.

## Water

Montreal's tap water is perfectly safe to drink.

## Weather

The average temperature in October in Montreal averages 8,1°C (46,6°F).

## Canada

Le Canada est un pays d'Amérique du Nord diversifié et constitué de 10 provinces et de 3 territoires. Situé dans la partie nord du continent, il s'étend de l'Atlantique au Pacifique, et est le deuxième plus grand pays du monde. Il partage avec les États-Unis la plus grande frontière du monde, totalisant 8900 km (ce qui inclut à la fois la terre et les voies navigables communes), ainsi que deux frontières maritimes avec le territoire danois autonome du Groenland et les îles d'outre-mer autonomes de Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon. Le Canada est un État fédéral gouverné comme une démocratie parlementaire et une monarchie constitutionnelle, avec la Reine Elizabeth II agissant comme chef de l'État. Le Canada a une population de 35 millions et possède deux langues officielles, l'anglais et le français.

## Montréal

Avec une population d'environ 1,7 millions (ou de plus de 3,8 millions si on inclut la grande région métropolitaine), Montréal est la plus grande ville de la province de Québec et la troisième ville la plus peuplée au Canada. Avec ses racines françaises, son héritage britannique et son éducation en Amérique du Nord, Montréal offre une fusion du flair du Vieux-Monde assorti de l'énergie du Nouveau-Monde, où l'architecture coloniale du 17<sup>e</sup> siècle partage le même horizon avec d'élégants gratte-ciel, et un mélange éclectique d'influences culturelles de partout dans le monde. ## Conduire

Québec utilise le système métrique ; les vitesses sont donc indiquées en kilomètres (100 Km / h = 62 mph) et le gaz est vendu au litre (3 3/4 litres = 1 gallon US). Les virages à droite sur une lumière rouge sont strictement interdits sur l'île de Montréal. ## Devise canadienne

La devise canadienne est le dollar canadien, qui se divise en 100 cents. Les coupures de billets se font en 5, 10, 20, 50 et 100 dollars. Les plus petites pièces sont de 5, 10, et 25 cents. Les cartes bancaires et les cartes de crédit sont également acceptées à peu près partout. L'argent comptant en devises étrangères n'est généralement pas accepté.

## Eau

## Électricité

La tension électrique au Canada est de 110-120 volts, 60 hertz (cycles par seconde). Les prises ont deux fiches plates. Les appareils multi-tension (ordinateurs portables, etc.) auront besoin d'un adaptateur. Pour les appareils de 220-240V, un transformateur élévateur de tension sera nécessaire en plus de l'adaptateur.

## Fuseau horaire

Montréal passe à l'heure avancée de l'Est (fuseau horaire d'été) le deuxième dimanche de mars et revient à l'heure normale de l'Est (fuseaux horaires d'hiver) le premier dimanche de novembre. La différence de temps entre le temps Montréal et Greenwich Mean Time est inférieure à 5 heures en hiver.

## **Gastronomie**

Montréal est la ville nord-américaine où l'on trouve le plus grand nombre de restaurants par habitant. La probabilité de trouver un établissement correspondant à ses envies est non seulement garantie, mais il y a aussi fort à parier que ses attentes soient comblées. La métropole est reconnue pour sa créativité et, à cet égard, les chefs de la scène culinaire locale ont l'art de se démarquer. 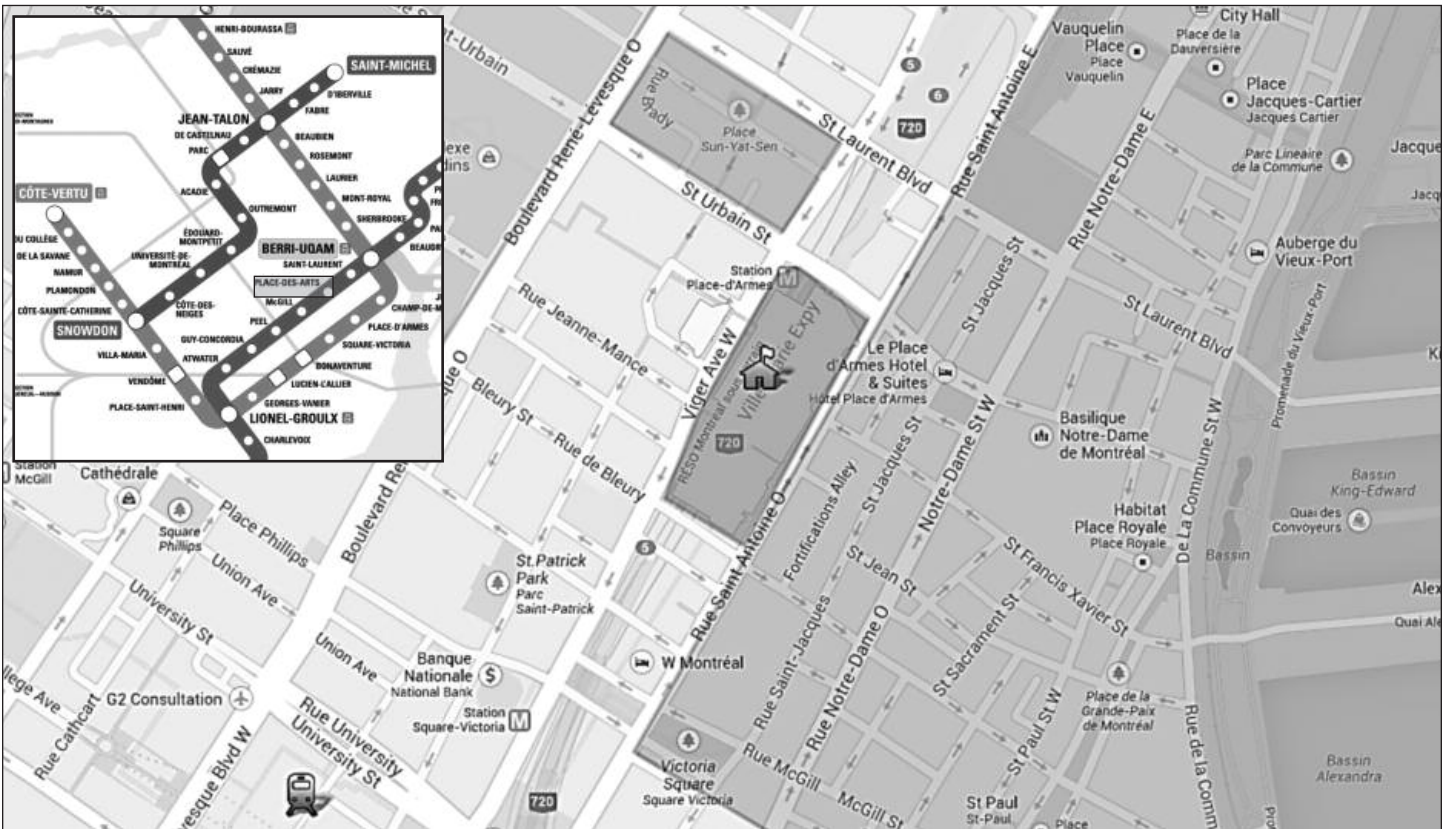
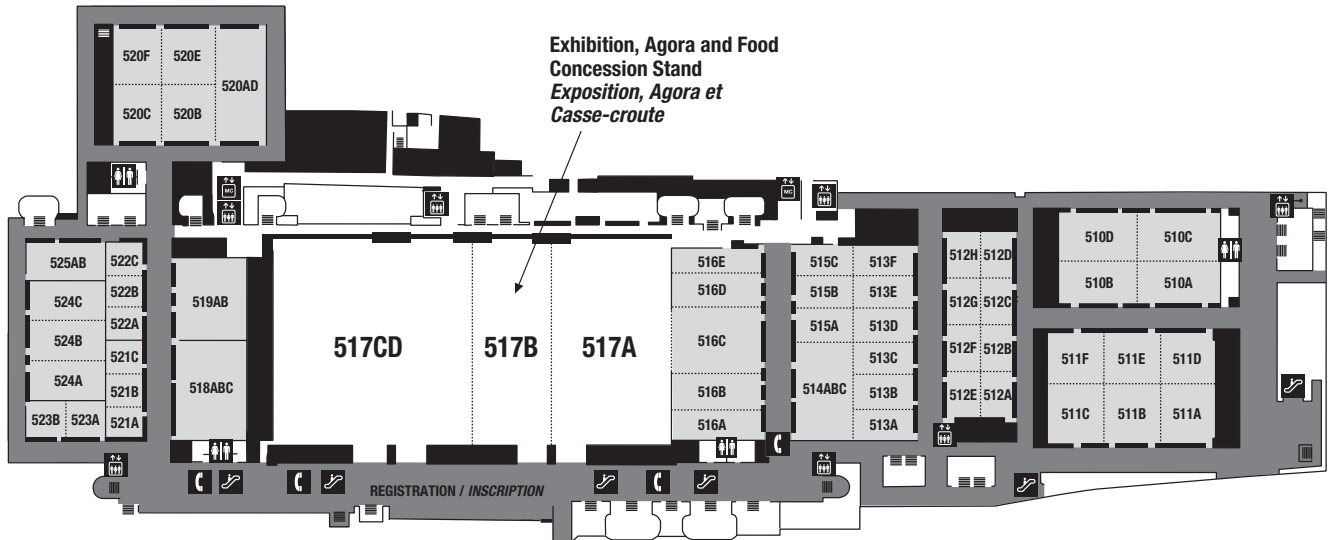

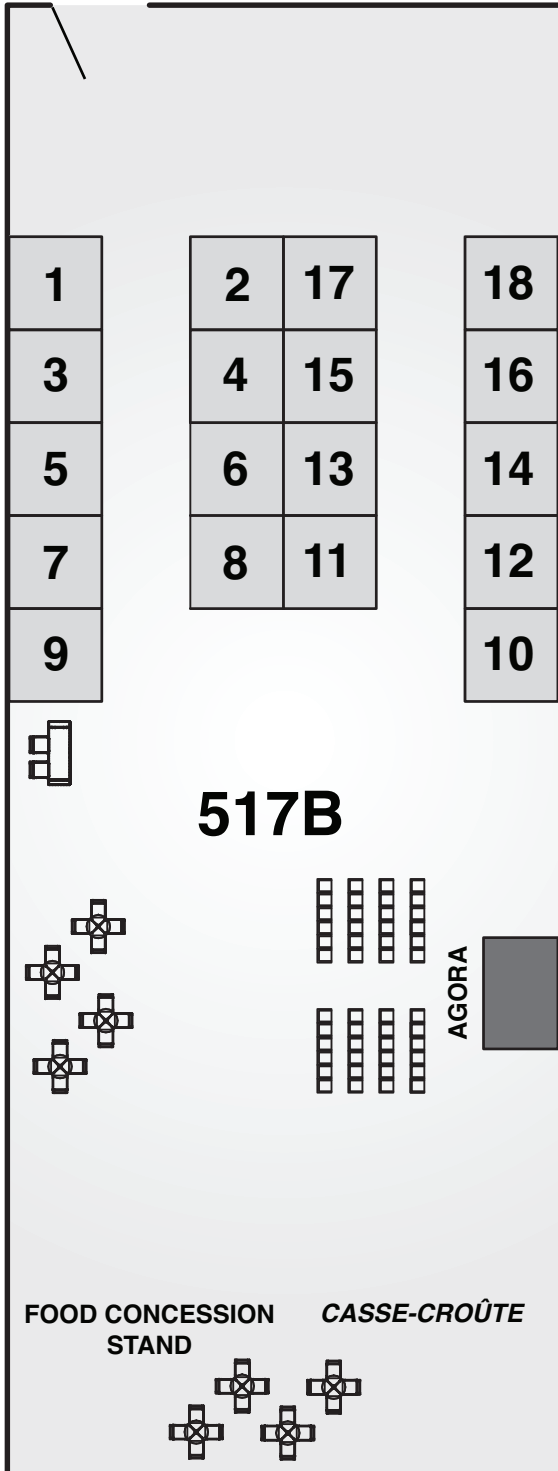

### Swarming Emotional Pianos - Augmented Emotion in Real Time

16:45 – 17:00

Presenter / Présentatrice: **Gee, Erin** – Concordia University, Canada

Erin Gee, a Master of Fine Arts student at Concordia University, is collaborating with neurophysiologist Vaughan Macefield at the MARCS institute (University of Western Sydney, Australia) to create a robotic musical system that amplifies the physiological markers of emotion of wired performers in real time, through a mobile set of robotic chimes.

The process begins with inserting fine microelectrode needles into a peripheral nerve of a subject, recording nerve activity transmitted through a single neuron. This allows software systems to eavesdrop on the subject's emotions and gather data, by recording nerve activity transmitted through a single neuron. To build a more accurate emotional map, the sensors also record the subject's blood flow, heart rate, sweat release and respiration. On stage, the actors will be challenged to summon a broad range of feelings, sending their physiological signals into software that parlays the data into a chorus of chimes, bell, and light.

Through her research in robotics, neuroscience, data sonification, and the reception of patterned sound, Gee hopes to explore how emotional experiences might be communicated and received aesthetically without any artistry on the part of the performer other than the mere experience of emotion itself. She offers the project as an example of bringing together fields and researchers spanning multiple disciplines in the sciences and the arts, to foster new conversations and avenues of scholarship.

### Digital Games, Social Science Research, and the Indie Game Movement

Computer games are a global industry worth more than \$64 billion annually, and a crucial engine of our digital economy. Canada is a world leader in this industry, with an estimated 20% of all games and game technologies in North America originating here. Games are a vital medium for entertainment, social commentary, and creative expression. Their impact extends far beyond entertainment and youth culture. Games are becoming an important component of education and training at all levels, bringing together experts in the social sciences, computing sciences, and fine arts. For example, educational games have transformed how medical staff train in medical ethics, cultural competencies, patient interviews and healthcare assessments.

The GRAND Network of Centres of Excellence ([grand-nce.ca](http://grand-nce.ca)) is a focal point for innovative collaboration between industry and research expertise in gaming technologies at Canada's leading universities. Research on games examines key aspects of creating and testing machine intelligence technology, developing novel man-machine interfaces, improving training, facilitating group interactions and interdisciplinary collaborations, enabling political and social commentary, and promoting social change.

The Independent game movement (or Indie Games) provides a unique platform for developing new Intellectual Property that brings together interdisciplinary teams of creative and academic talent. The creation of a vibrant network of Indie developers, coupled with supportive research communities and robust incubation activities, diversifies the Canadian economy and promotes the development of small and medium enterprises.

Jason Della Rocca is a member of the GRAND Research Management Committee and a co-founder of Execution Labs, a game incubation studio in Montreal. He will discuss the challenges that face the Indie game movement in Canada and how on-going research in the Social Sciences can help ensure Canada's place as a world leader in game production.
